



QUARTERLY HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX REPORT

(Hotels, Motels, Short-term Rentals, and other Short-term Sleeping Units)

Every person owning, operating, managing or controlling any hotel or Short-term rental within the City of Azle shall collect a tax of seven percent (7%) on the rent paid, unless an exemption is provided by law. Allowable exemptions to the local Hotel Occupancy Tax are listed on the reverse of this return form. This tax is due and payable quarterly on or before the last day of the month following each quarterly period. For Failure to pay by the due date, the lodging provider is subject to a specific penalty of fifteen percent (15%).

HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX RETURN

Allowable Exemptions from Hotel Taxes

The hotel occupancy tax levied by the City of Azle does not apply to and shall not be imposed upon:

1. a permanent resident of a hotel;
2. a corporation or association that is organized and operated exclusively for a religious, charitable, or educational purpose if no part of the net earnings of the corporation or association inure to the benefit of a private share holder or individual;
3. the United States, the State of Texas, or an agency, institution, board, or commission of the State of Texas other than an institution of higher education, or upon an officer or employee of one of these governmental entities when that officer or employee is traveling on or otherwise engaged in the course of official duties for the governmental entity.
