Rules, Regulations, and Fees Governing the Use of the Village of Cornwall-on-Hudson's Cornwall Landing/ Donahue Memorial Park Boat Launch Kayak Rack

Season, time & fees:

Kayak rack storage is available May 1 through October 31.

Usage hours: Sunrise – Dusk (one-half hour before dark)

Kayak Rack Permit Fee: Village Resident: \$200 per rack space; Village Senior (65+): \$150 per rack space. Town Resident: \$250 per rack space; Town Senior (65+): \$200 per rack space. Non-Resident: \$300 per rack space; Non-Resident Senior (65+) \$250 per rack space. Limit to one rack space & permit per applicant. Fee is non-refundable.

General Guidelines:

- Kayak- Federal, State, and Local Rules apply
- Valid Cornwall-on-Hudson Kayak Rack Permit Sticker required. (Sticker must be placed above water line or on top of your kayak.)
- Rack spaces are non-transferable.
- Kayak permits are non-transferable.
- One kayak per applicant.
- Hours: sunrise – dusk (one-half hour before dark); Memorial Day – Labor Day the hours are sunrise – 10 pm per Village Code §122-5.
- All waterfront parking rules and regulations must be followed (valid parking permit).
- Area may be closed due to inclement weather, unsafe conditions, maintenance, or special events.
- Locks and chains are required and are to be provided by the rack space holder.
- Kayak to remain locked while on the rack.
- Kayak and accessories must be secured and without obstruction to the removal and re-racking of any neighboring kayak space(s).
- Do not lean kayak on other kayaks. This can cause damage.
- Lost or damaged kayaks and items are not the responsibility of the Village of Cornwall-on-Hudson.
- Be advised that leaving your kayak on the rack over the winter is at your own risk. The Village of Cornwall-on-Hudson is not responsible for theft or any damage due to weather, vandalism or other means. Note: the sun and cold weather can make your kayak brittle when left outside.
- Rack space holders are responsible for keeping the area neat and clean.
- No climbing on the racks.
- No person shall enter the launch area or operate or ride as a passenger in a kayak under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- Adult supervision of children is required in the rack and launch area.

Kayak Operating Rules:

- The permit holder is responsible for the safety of those in their craft.
- Operation of the craft is solely at the operator's own risk.
- Permit holders and guests should be strong, experienced swimmers. Enter the waters at your own risk.
- Permit holders must be aware that environmental conditions such as waves, and strong changeable currents can overwhelm adept paddlers and swimmers. It is important to know the water and weather conditions before going out.
- Float plans are recommended. Be sure to notify someone of your trip plans before going out and check in when you return.
- U.S. Coast Guard approved Personal Floatation Devices (PFD's) are required.
- Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult.
- Carrying a spare paddle, pump, and whistle is recommended in case of an emergency.
- The Hudson River is a major waterway, paddlers must be aware of power boats and other watercrafts.
