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### **Acknowledgement of Rules Regarding Soliciting in Holly Springs**

1. You must have a valid permit before beginning solicitation in Holly Springs.
2. You must display the permit and state-issued photo identification upon demand.
3. It is unlawful to conduct any solicitation outside of the following hours:
  - a. September 2 to April 30 - 9:00 am to 6:00 pm
  - b. May 1 to September 1 – 9:00 am to 8:00 pm
4. It is unlawful to solicit, peddle, or attempt to do either at any property that contains a “No Soliciting” sign posted conspicuously near the front door.
5. The chief of police or any sworn police officer or any other designee of the chief of police may revoke a permit when there is a reasonable factual basis that doing so would be in the best interest of the health, safety, welfare, or morals of the public.
6. Any permit granted is good for 12 months from date of issue, and may be renewed by submitting a new application.
7. Violations of the ordinance shall be a Class 3 Misdemeanor with a fine of not more than \$500.00.
