GARAGE/YARD SALE INFORMATION

You have been issued a Garage/Yard Sale Permit by the Borough of Punxsutawney. The following information must be adhered to at all times:

1. When your permit was issued, you were asked if you were placing signs on any property other than your own. If you answered "yes", you were required to bring in written permission from the property owner and also pay a \$10.00 sign deposit. That \$10.00 will be returned to you when your sale is over and your signs have been taken down. If you answered "no" - you **cannot** place signs anywhere other than on the property where the sale is taking place. If you answered "no", and you place signs somewhere other than at the place of the sale, you are in violation of our Garage Sale Ordinance and you are subject to having a fine assessed against you for this violation. If you did not obtain the written permission and pay the \$10.00 deposit, **do not** place signs anywhere other than on the property where the sale is taking place. At no time are signs permitted on telephone poles, street sign posts, Borough or State property. This regulation covers signs, balloons, flags, streamers, arrows, and anything else that is meant to call attention to your sale.
2. You are permitted to have a sale for up to five (5) consecutive days (5 days in a row). You are also given the option of having a rain date. That means if you are not able to open up your sale because of rain, you can call the office and schedule another day. If you choose to open up, but because of the rain, you did not do too well, you are not entitled to a rain date. You are only entitled to a rain date if you did not open up at all that day.
